

Morris Museum of Art, 1 Tenth Street, Augusta, GA. **Through Dec. 12** - "Linda Fantuzzo: Penumbra". A master of atmosphere, mood, and light, famed Charleston, SC, artist Linda Fantuzzo is represented by more than twenty paintings drawn from her most recent body of work in a new exhibition "Linda Fantuzzo: Penumbra". The landscape and interior paintings and drawings in this exhibition are rendered with a quiet, abstracted simplicity. The inclusion of stairs, ladders, windows, and doors suggests an unseen yet palpable human presence. The title "Penumbra", a term that means "a space of partial illumination," references light's transitions. In these works Fantuzzo connects the literal transitions of light to the metaphorical transitions and impermanence of the human experience. Admission: Yes. Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum, 306 Bradley Street, STE C, Carrollton. **Through Dec. 18** - "Making It Through Sheltering In Place". In mid-March 2020, as schools and businesses closed in hope of "flattening the curve" of COVID-19, many of us began "sheltering in place" - staying home to keep ourselves and others safe. We heard people saying "When I make it through this..." and we realized that many of our followers were literally "making" it through - first sewing masks, then turning to creating quilts and other textiles to cope with and express their emotions and concerns during this challenging time.
