City Art Gallery in Columbia, SC, is proud to present a new exhibition entitled *Selected Work from the 30 Year Retrospective: Made in America -1983- 2013* by artist Marge Loudon Moody, with an opening reception on Jan. 17, 2013, from 5-8pm. The exhibition will be open for viewing through Mar. 2, 2013.

to celebration and reflection. She states, "The work in this show, the first of several in the US and Europe, is a selection of work completed over the past 30 years." She creates abstract paintings on canvas and mixed media pieces.

Moody was educated in Scotland. In 1972, she earned an Honors Degree from Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art, Dundee, Scotland. She gained her Certificate of Secondary School Teaching in Art from Moray House College of Education in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1973. From 1973 to 1982 Moody worked and lived in Edinburgh, Scotland, as a professional artist. In 1983, she moved to the United States and started her career. She is currently employed as an associate professor of art at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, SC.

Moody has been featured in numerous solo and mixed exhibits throughout the US – including New York City and Washington, DC, as well as in South and North Carolina. Galleries included are McColl Center for Visual Art, Dalton Gallery and Pease Gallery to name a few. Her work is included in many permanent public and private collections, including the South Carolina State Art Collection, MUSC's Carolina Contemporary Collection at

Ashley Tower and was recently on display in the SC State Museum's *Abstract Art in South Carolina: 1949 – 2012* exhibition. Throughout 2013 Moody's work will be featured in four solo exhibitions - in Columbia, Charlotte, Chicago and Dundee, Scotland. Others are planned in Portugal and England in 2014. Over the years, she has received several awards for her work. From Winthrop University, she has been the recipient of research grants and endowment awards. Her dedication to art has earned three Regional Artists Project Grants from Charlotte-Mecklenburg Arts & Science Council, NC.

Gallery Director Wendy Wells comments, "We decided some months ago to host a Retrospective Exhibition of Moody's paintings and the anticipation began. Moody is one of the finest abstract painters in South Carolina and I am sure the Southeast and USA. Her work is bold, layered with intention and sureness of her composition and a more than highly developed color sensibility. City Art Gal-

City Art Gallery is located in the historic Congaree Vista area in Columbia.


