Downtown Greensboro, Inc. Presents International Art Installation by Christopher Janney

Visitors to downtown Greensboro, NC, will be able to experience an Urban Musical Forest as part of Downtown Greensboro, Inc.'s (DGI) Downtown in December presented by Allegacy programming. *Sonic Forest* will be open to visitors

our Downtown in December experiences this year, and *Sonic Forest* is evidence of that," says Zack Matheny, DGI President and CEO. "We wanted free, outdoor programming that any family would feel safe enjoying during this holiday season."

Sonic Forest is a multi-sensory, interactive installation that is part of Christopher Janney's "Urban Musical Instruments" series. The *Sonic Forest* is composed of 16, eight-foot tall by ten-inch diameter columns each containing audio speakers, lights and photo-electric sensors. Interacting with the electronic trees triggers a series of events – from an original score of melodic tones, environmental sounds, and spoken or whispered expressions to an ever-changing color palette of LED lights. Everyone who walks through this instrument calls up their own "musical oasis."

The entire installation will sound the time of day each hour. A "ghost in the machine" will trigger the installation at random moments, and the installation will

"play by itself" for short intervals when no one has passed through it.

The exhibit is free to the public. While sanitization policies will be in use, a reminder to the public to wear a mask, maintain socially distancing and stay home if you've been feeling ill.
