Spartanburg Art Museum, Chapman Cultural Arts Center, 200 East St. John Street, Spartanburg. **Apr. 1 - May 16** - "Bread and Circus: Ceramic Sculptures of Diana Farfan". A reception will be held on Apr. 11, from 5-8pm with a gallery talk given at 6pm. Colombian-born sculptor Diana Farfan is known for her playful and surrealist clay marionettes, puppets, and toys. Her pieces often illustrate and play on themes of the human condition, human body, and our relationship to modernity. Farfan's representation of the human form is distinct, using intentionally disproportionate forms and grotesque characteristics. Her sculpture, though often invoking deep and serious meanings, nonetheless is still able to capture a feeling of whimsy and wonder. **Apr. 15 - June 22** - "Out of Line: Randy Shull". Asheville, NC-based artist Randy Shull's exhibit explores the classic iconography of the contours of the USA. Through a variety of media and styles, Shull's exhibition bridges the gap between art and the myriad themes connoted by the familiar shape. Trained in carpentry and furniture design, Shull's work evolved naturally over time from furniture to painting and large-scale installations. Admission: Yes. The Johnson Collection Gallery, 154 W. Main Street, Spartanburg. **Through Apr. 11** - "Beyond the Harlem Renaissance". Following the example set by W. E. B. DuBois and Alain Locke during the New Negro Movement of the 1920s to 1940s, pioneering African American artists supported cultural agendas that would benefit black communities and improve public perception of their race. Early efforts were concentrated in Northern urban centers, such as Harlem and Philadelphia, where African American populations swelled due to the migration of millions of black Southerners eager to escape Jim Crow. Beyond these metropolitan areas, however, a simultaneous cultural renaissance was occurring in Washington, DC, Atlanta, and other Southern cities. Spanning the twentieth century, this exhibition presents paintings created by the Southern forerunners of African American art alongside works by their innovative successors, highlighting their connections


