






Cultural Affairs to partner on the project. A committee of historical experts, educators, and community leaders was formed in 2019 and collaborated to identify key events in Hilton Head's history. Eight local artists were then identified by Art League of Hilton Head to partner with the historians to accurately depict these moments in time.

A depiction of the Greens Shell Ring, which is estimated to more than 4000 years old, starts the hallway gallery. Other paintings illustrate the period of European exploration, colonization & plantation/en-slavement era, Mitchelville and the Gullah-Geechee community, as well as modern-day Hilton Head. In addition to the 10 canvases, the exhibit also features a 150-foot mural of contemporary community change makers and canvases by students inspired by their experiences during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The project was underwritten by the Town's Office of Cultural Affairs as one of its Community Creates Initiatives. The purpose of the project was to educate the students about the significant role Hilton Head Island has played in our country's history. Harper says, "I conceived the idea when it became apparent that many of the 1000 students attending the middle school were unaware of the Island's history and its role in shaping America. Beyond inspiring the students to learn more about where they live, the artwork brings this

main corridor of our school to life." When COVID restrictions are removed, there will be a public opening reception at the school accompanied by gallery tours led by student docents.

Tanger Outlet 1 in Bluffton, SC, Offers SpringFest - June 5, 2021

Tanger Outlet 1 in Bluffton, SC, will offer SpringFest, with Lowcountry Made's artisan market, from noon-5pm, on June 5, 2021. The event showcases open air shopping for all things local, original and handmade.

The market will encompass the entire second row of the parking lot in front of Saks OFF 5th at Tanger Outlets 1 in Bluffton with over 60 vendors. The event will also feature food trucks and live entertainment.

SpringFest is organized by Lowcountry Made, a promotional organization that aims to support local artists, artisans and makers. Tanger Outlet 1 will also be the artisan market venue for FallFest Oct. 23 and a

Christmas market on Dec. 4, 2021.

"These markets have been vital for local makers and their small businesses to thrive. It's hard to compete in an area with rising costs for retail space and not to mention a pandemic," said Katie Silva, founder of Lowcountry Made.
